We shall refrain from accepting gifts, favors or promises of future benefit that might compromise our independence of judgment or action or give the appearance of being compromised.

We will behave in a manner that does not bring discredit or embarrassment to the City of Irwindale. We will be honest in thought and deed in both our personal and official lives.

SUBJECT: Reorganization of Planning Commission

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Planning Commission select the Chair and Vice-Chair.

SUMMARY:

It is appropriate at this time to reorganize the Planning Commission, including the selection of a Chair and Vice Chair. In order to complete the re-organization, the following procedure is suggested:

1. The Planning Commission Secretary opens the nominations for the office of Chair. Any Commissioner may nominate another Commissioner or themselves. No second to the nomination is required.
2. After receiving all nominations, the Planning Commission Secretary closes the nominations.
3. The Planning Commission Secretary then conducts the election of the Chair by roll call vote. If there is more than one nomination, a roll call vote is conducted in the order nominated until a Chair is elected by majority vote.
4. Once selected, the new Chair then opens nominations for Vice-Chair in the same manner.
5. After receiving all nominations, the Chair closes the nominations.
6. The Chair then conducts the election of the Vice-Chair by roll call vote. If there is more than one nomination, a roll call vote is conducted in the order nominated until a Vice-Chair is elected by majority vote.

Exhibit A

2.32.020 - Members—Appointment—Removal—Vacancies.

A. The planning commission shall consist of five members. Each member of the commission shall be nominated to fill a position on the commission. The first nomination to fill a vacancy shall be made by the mayor. If the first nominee fails to receive three affirmative votes of the city council, subsequent nominations may be made by any member of the city council, excluding the mayor. In the event no nominee receives three affirmative votes, after all members of the city council have made a nomination, the mayor may then make another nomination, followed by all members of the city council. Nominations shall continue to be made in such order (mayor first, remaining councilmembers next) until a nominee is approved by three affirmative votes. The first nominee to be approved by not less than three members of the city council evidenced by a resolution duly introduced and passed by not less than three affirmative votes thereon shall be appointed to the commission. No person shall be eligible for appointment to the planning commission unless he or she is a resident and a registered, qualified voter of the city at the time of appointment. At all times during such commissioner's term of office he or she shall continue to be a resident and a registered, qualified voter of the city.

B. The terms of the members shall be for four years. The terms in effect on the date of the ordinance codified in this section shall be as determined by the city council on December 12, 1979, as follows:

- C. Commission members may be removed with or without cause, by a majority vote of the city council at any time.
- D. Unexcused absence from a majority portion of three successive meetings shall be deemed a resignation.
- E. Vacancies to the commission shall be filled by the council in the same manner as new appointments are made, except that such an appointee shall serve only for the unexpired term of the person whose seat he has been appointed to.

CHAIR FRYMARK Seeing no New Business, we're going to move on to Item Number 4, which is our Public Hearing.

CHAIR FRYMARK But it doesn't seem like we have anything for Public Hearing tonight. So, we're going to go ahead and continue and just move on to Item Number 5 which are, which is one Item rather a discussion Item.

DISCUSSION ITEMS/ PRESENTATIONS

CHAIR FRYMARK A presentation sounds like an update regarding our Hazard Mitigation Plan update, and I believe we're going to have Brandi or Jarrod? Hi Jarrod, welcome.

ASSISTANT PLANNER
PALMER Good evening Commissioners.

CHAIR FRYMARK Thank you.

ASSISTANT PLANNER
PALMER So, tonight is going to be Part 2 of the Hazard Mitigation Plan for 2025 update. This will be 2 parts, so we'll have the public outreach overview as well as the results from the survey, with data provided by our consultant Dynamic Planning and Science. So, for the public outreach aspect of this update, we've been going through a couple of different types of outreach approaches. One of those has been the City's and the consultant's web pages, that are available for the public. Both of these pages from the City and our consultant offer the public ways to learn more about the HMP, the update that we're doing as well as to take the survey and to inform them on upcoming events where they might be able to participate in person. So, for that survey it is open to

the public and it's available in English or Spanish. As of Monday, we have a little over 90 responses to the survey, which is really good, and the goal is 150. So, we hope that more people will take it. If you haven't already we do encourage you to spread the word and take that survey. So, some other events we've been doing have been in person ones. Mi Fiesta had a great turnout. We were there to help raise awareness in the community and we had goodies for everybody young and old. Surveys could be filled out in person or digitally and you can also take those at home, so again if you haven't, please try and take it it's very important. More recently though we were at the Christmas Spectacular. So, we had a booth there. That had a great turnout that night. It was cold, but a lot of people were there. Great resources for everybody. The parents that came by were able to take the survey, and the children were able to take our word searches. We had some really great word search results come out of that. And everyone of course loved the chocolates.

CHAIR FRYMARK

I mean who wouldn't.

ASSISTANT PLANNER
PALMER

We also had our Pizza with a Planner event. So, this was here at City Hall. It was a bit more of a smaller group but that was good, because we were able to hear from a lot of people on what their specific interest was regarding planning as well as regarding the HMP update. As you can see Cynthia is there handing out pizza. So, for the survey results so far, we have information on opinions of those who live and or work here in the city, as well as what hazards have been experienced by people. It's helped us to determine potential severity of impacts from natural hazards or disasters, and we're understanding what concerns people the most with this update. So as of December 15th, it has been 93 responses. Again, that goal is 150. Approximately 48% of those who replied to the survey do live in Irwindale. The rest are people that just work here in the City. But again, we want 150 so spread the word. Anyone who hasn't taken it, please do take the survey. So, with this you can see some of the results from one of the questions. What we found here is that most people have experienced the hazard of earthquakes, as most of us have in Southern California. Followed by that is severe weather, so a lot of people have been experiencing the effects of severe weather in our area. And approximately 61% of the respondents to the survey, believe that their property could be at risk of damage due to an event from a natural hazard or disaster that might occur. And the top concerns from people that replied to our survey were earthquake, severe weather, and drought. Followed by wildfires and climate change related disasters. So, we have recently finished with our in-person activities, so the Christmas Spectacular booth that we had, as well as the Pizza with the Planner event. We'll have some more activities in the late spring around April, I believe we'll have a booth at the Easter Extravaganza. As well as some other outreach opportunities later in the spring but currently our consultant is helping to develop the actual documentation for the HMP. And so they'll be hard at work with that for

the first three (3) months of the year. And if you want to hear more about the HMP update, we will have our consultant here on January 14th for the City Council Meeting. They'll be able to provide even more data from the survey that we've had so far, as well as future glimpses of what the new HMP will look like. So, I thank you for listening tonight. Again, here are some resources you can use such as our City's website. And if you have any questions, you can reach out to City Staff or even our consultants. At these e-mail addresses or phone numbers. And again, please take our survey. It's available in English or Spanish and anyone can take it. Thank you, Commissioners, that's all for tonight.

CHAIR FRYMARK

Thank you Jarrod. I do have a quick comment, I want to just say thank you to you and the Planning Department for all of its outreach efforts. I've heard from multiple residents in the community, and they really like being able to go to City functions and be able to provide their feedback. So, I think that what we are doing is working and I just want you guys to know and to hear that, if you're not hearing that already. Cynthia, thank you for being at Pizza with the Planner. We just see more visibility coming from the team and it's noticeable. And I just want to say thank you to everyone that's putting forth the effort. Not that it wasn't there before, but it's very visible there and so I think that speaks volumes to efforts to engage with our community, so thank you.

If you have any other questions, we're here to answer them. So.

A few. I was curious I missed that slide, Jarrod, looking down here that split of the residents versus workers in the City, what was the split again?

Forty-eight percent residents. Though the rest is people that just work in the City they might live nearby or just in the area.

COMMISSIONER
MIRANDA

And as far as the engagement results, as far as, what they think would damage their property. What they are basically fearful. What was that exactly that they're fearful of exactly and why? And in the context.

ASSOCIATE PLANNER
TYLER

Could you repeat the question?

COMMISSIONER
MIRANDA

Yeah in the results he mentioned natural hazards, what were they practically fearful of, or what was their concern in that context of their, that engagement results. And probably the risk of damages. What was the risk they were feeling it was risking their property particularly?

ASSOCIATE PLANNER
TYLER

They didn't get into too much.

COMMISSIONER MIRANDA	Specifics?
ASSOCIATE PLANNER TYLER	I think a lot of it had to do you know we're just earthquake damage like, it made possibly damaged the foundation or the walls you know those kind of things.
COMMISSIONER MIRANDA	Okay.
ASSOCIATE PLANNER TYLER	There was some concern, I think we've talked with a few people about like you know what happens if we lose our electricity or gas. So those are a couple of other issues that come up when we had the conversations at some of the meetings too that we've been doing, the community meetings. So, yeah that's kind of been where people are coming from.
COMMISSIONER MIRANDA	Right. And the other question is as our Chair mentioned, I'm really happy with the responses we're getting. This is one of the best responses we had any outreach we've had but we were a little short. But are we, when people get into the QR codes for instance, are we getting contact information like opting in for instance like an SMS, MS campaign where we can follow with them in the future kind of thing like that? I guess...
CHAIR FRYMARK	Like track them down? Commissioner Miranda.
COMMISSIONER MIRANDA	No just saying other events where you know other surveys we get very poor responses so this is a very good response so....
ASSOCIATE PLANNER TYLER	Yeah, I think a lot of it, I'm sorry I don't mean to interrupt, a lot of it has to do with the giveaway stuff but also engagement and that's been really impressive. We've actually had people do the surveys in Spanish too that don't speak English. That's really hopeful that, you know, we're actually meeting, reaching out to a larger group of people too which I think is pretty awesome.
COMMISSIONER MIRANDA	Yeah, it's great, yeah.
ASSOCIATE PLANNER TYLER	Yeah, so it's really nice and fun because sometimes the kids are a good way to get to the parents because the parents are like yea I'll do that.
COMMISSIONER MIRANDA	Oh, yeah.
ASSOCIATE PLANNER TYLER	We've had activities and other things to do so that's been really helpful.

COMMISSIONER MIRANDA	Speaking of the word search for the kids, any savants we can like you know foster up you know.
ASSOCIATE PLANNER TYLER	We got a couple of kids who, well one he did it really quick up there like wow so yeah.
COMMISSIONER MIRANDA	So a future Jarrod.
ASSOCIATE PLANNER TYLER	Good response.
COMMISSIONER MIRANDA	Excellent, thank you.
CHAIR FRYMARK	Commissioner comments. Okay well, thank you so much for this update and we look forward to participating and hearing in the Council Meeting where it sounds like there's going to be a lot more detailed information in the new year so sounds good. Thank you very much. Okay, so we are going to move on from Item Number 5 and move on to Item Number 6 Community Development Director Report, and I believe that is... Okay, wonderful thank you.

SENIOR PLANNER JONES	Good evening Chair, members of the Planning Commission. I'll be speaking on Marilyn's behalf tonight.
