The City Council will hear public comments on matters not listed on the agenda during the Spontaneous Communications period.

Pursuant to provisions of the **Brown Act**, no action may be taken on a matter unless it is listed on the agenda, or unless certain emergency or special circumstances exist. The City Council may direct staff to investigate and/or schedule certain matters for consideration at a future City Council meeting.

Code of Ethics

We will base our decisions on the merit and substance of that business. We will be fair and equitable in all actions, claims or transactions. Background and Analysis:

At the City Council meeting held on Wednesday, April 13, 2022, the City Council received an update on the requests from Northview High School and Covina Vikings Youth Football Organization requesting a fireworks stand and permit to sell fireworks within the City.

Chapter 8.16 of the IMC sets forth the rules and regulations pertaining to the issuance of permits to sell fireworks as well as the purchase and use of fireworks within the City. Any amendment to the subject code chapter would need to be made by ordinance and would go into effect thirty days following the ordinance's adoption.

The City Council expressed its desire to expand the definition of "Organization" to include Covina Vikings Youth Football Organization for the fireworks sales period during the year 2022 and directed staff to bring back an ordinance for 1st reading at special meeting on Monday, April 18, 2022, amending Chapter 8.16 of the City's Municipal Code.

Proposed Ordinance No. 760 amends IMC section 8.16.010 by revising the definition of "Organization" to include Covina Vikings Youth Football Organization. The Ordinance also provides that the amendment will "sunset" or expire upon completion of the sales period for the year 2022, as set forth in IMC section 8.16.070(L).

ORDINANCE NO. 760

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IRWINDALE AMENDING SECTION 8.16.010, OF CHAPTER 8.16 OF THE IRWINDALE MUNICIPAL CODE AMENDING THE DEFINITION OF AN ORGANIZATION

WHEREAS, Chapter 8.16 of the Irwindale Municipal Code (IMC) establishes rules and regulations related to the purchase and use of fireworks within the City, as well as for the issuance of permits to sell fireworks; and

WHEREAS, the City periodically reviews its ordinances to ensure it is achieving its goals, while continuing to adhere to legal requirements; and

WHEREAS, the City Council now desires to amend IMC Chapter 8.16, Section 8.16.010, as detailed below, to expand its organization list to include Covina Vikings Youth Football Organization for the fireworks sales period during the year 2022.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IRWINDALE DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City Council of the City of Irwindale finds that the above recitals are true and correct, and incorporated herein by this reference.

SECTION 2. Subsection D entitled "Organizations" of Section 8.16.010 entitled "Definitions" of Chapter 8.16 entitled "of the Irwindale Municipal Code is hereby amended and shall read as follows (deleted text, if any, is shown in ~~strikethrough~~, new text, if any, is shown in ***bold & italics***):

D. "Organization" ~~means~~ ***shall have the following meanings:***

1. any nonprofit organization, corporation, association, organized primarily for veteran, patriotic, welfare, civic betterment, religious or charitable purposes, which has its principal and permanent meeting place, office, or place of worship within the city, and has been organized and established in the city for a minimum period of one year, continuously, preceding the filing of an application for permit under this chapter, ***and***
2. ***Covina Vikings Youth Football Organization. This subsection 2 shall automatically terminate and be of no further force and effect upon completion of the fireworks sales period for the year 2022, as set forth in this Chapter and subsection 8.16.070(L).***

SECTION 3. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision

shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance, and each section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase hereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional due to the writs of mandate issued by the Court.

SECTION 4. Certification and Effective Date. The City Clerk shall certify as to the passage and adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause the same to be posted at the designated locations in the City of Irwindale. This ordinance shall be in effective on the thirtieth (30th) day after the day of its adoption.
